CREA Principles

- > Siting decisions for renewable energy facilities (including transmission) should be made at the local level within the parameters of Oregon Land Use Planning Goals.
- > CREA supports siting of renewable energy projects that maximize the conservation of high value farm land.
- > CREA believes that new renewable projects serving Oregon load should be sited in-state to the extent practical.
- > CREA supports the opportunity for state and local governments to consider economic incentives such as property tax adjustments and subsidized infrastructure which promote development of renewable energy facilities.
- > CREA supports fair labor standards and incentives for training and apprenticeships that are flexible and recognize regional labor availability and local economic conditions.
- > CREA supports local energy self determination and opportunities for small scale, locally owned projects to provide and sell power into the grid.
- > CREA supports improvement in the transmission system and recognize the need for a more efficient and effective system to move energy from where it can be generated to where it is needed.
- > CREA supports the development of renewable energy storage systems of all types and incentives which would expedite the development of these resources.
- > CREA believes in the need to accelerate the pace and scale of renewable energy.
